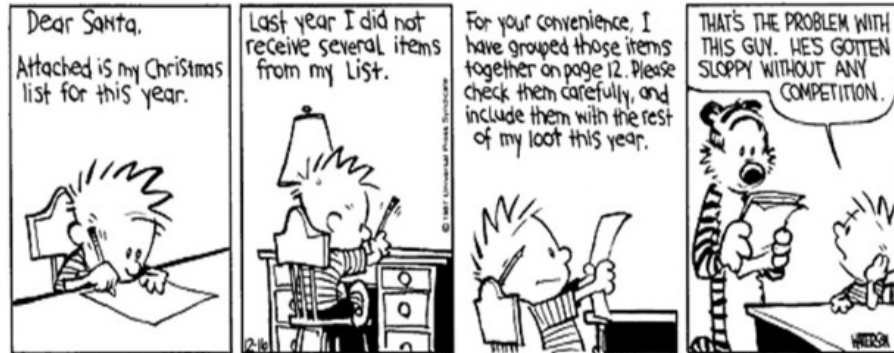

### Suggestions by members on how to teach online:

- Pre-record lectures, and let students view them at their leisure, and use the live session for discussions and elaborations
- Prepare students for the live session with the guidance of a series of questions sent to them
- To ensure that students are in the classroom, ask questions randomly, and if they don't answer, repeat in a few minutes.
- Assign specific issues to be presented in the live sessions by students
- In Zoom you can facilitate parallel discussions of groups of students in separate "zoom rooms"
- Use quick quizzes or random surveys to keep them on their toes.
